1993 SHIRAZ

The 1993 vintage was made at Rockford Winery in the Barossa Valley, using open fermenters and the basket press. The Fruit flavour and colour from these unique berries has been highlighted using French and American oak fermentation and maturation.

The vines which produced the grapes for this wine were planted in 1847, before the Ballarat gold rush, the American Civil War or the Russian Revolution – and not long after the City of Adelaide was settled. They are among the oldest Shiraz vines in the world.

Our best yet! It is in our view even a little bit better than the 1992, which was given 5 Stars in James Halliday's Pocket Compendium of Wine. It is typical of the concentrated 1993 Shiraz's from the better Barossa Valley Vineyards, and the concentrated flavours of chocolate, mint and cherry overtones are typical of this extremely low yield year. Again we have had to limit the purchase of this product, due to low stocks, to six bottles per order.

The Wine

Harvested	– Mid March
Bottled	– 10 th April, 1995
Oak Treatment	– All seasoned American Oak Hogsheads
Colour	– Brick Red
Nose	– Spicy, Blackcurrant overtones
Palate	– Chocolate, mint, and cherry
Cellar	– 10 years
Alcohol	– 14.3% alc/vol.
